Braille Alphabet

The Braille alphabet was invented by Louis Braille to help people who are blind read. The Braille system uses a series of raised dots that people "read" with their fingers.

- 1. To make your own set of Braille letters, use the toothpick to place a small dot of white glue on the black dots of each letter below. When the glue dries, you will have created large Braille letters.
- 2. Cut out each letter and try to arrange the letters in alphabetical order using your sense of touch.
