Braille Alphabet

The Braille alphabet was invented by Louis Braille to help people who are blind read. The Braille system uses a series of raised dots that people "read" with their fingers.

1. To make your own set of Braille letters, use the toothpick to place a small dot of white glue on the black dots of each letter below. When the glue dries, you will have created large Braille letters.
2. Cut out each letter and try to arrange the letters in alphabetical order using your sense of touch.
