Special School District Meeting

Notice is hereby given that a special meeting of the residents of Lansing Central School District, Towns of Lansing, Dryden and Groton, Tompkins County, New York, qualified to vote at school meetings in said district, will be held at the Lansing Middle School Auditorium Lobby on **Tuesday, December 11, 2007**, for the transaction of such business as is authorized by the education law. Polls will be open from **12:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m.**, for the purposes of adopting a proposal to establish a school district public library and raise funds for its annual operation, and for electing nine school district public library Board Trustees.

The following proposition

shall be voted on December 11, 2007:

QUESTION

Shall the Lansing Community Library Center be permanently established as a school district public library for the benefit and free use of all residents of the Lansing Central School District, such library to have nine Library Board Trustees, whose members are elected by the voters of the School District for terms of up to five years, and be authorized to raise \$105,310.00, separate and apart from the annual School District budget, to support and maintain such library, said appropriation to be raised annually by a tax upon the taxable property of said School District and to be an annual appropriation thereafter until changed by further vote of the majority of electors of the Lansing Central School District, and to be levied and collected yearly as are other general taxes?

Nine vacancies are to be filled on the Library Board of Trustees. The nine candidates receiving the highest number of votes each will be elected to five-year terms.

Each petition must be directed to the Clerk of the District; must be signed by at least 31 qualified voters of the district, must state the residence of each signer and must state the name and residence of the candidate. Petition forms are available at the office of the superintendent of schools, beginning October 19, 2007.

And notice is also given that petitions nominating candidates for the Library Board must be filed with the Clerk of the District no later than **Tuesday, November 13, 2007 at 5:00 p.m.**

And notice is hereby given, that applications for absentee ballots may be obtained by qualified voters beginning Friday, November 16, 2007 by contacting the School District Clerk between the hours of 12:00 p.m. and 4:00 p.m. on weekdays prior to Tuesday, December 11, 2007. Completed applications must be received by the School District Clerk by 4:00 p.m. on December 4, 2007 if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter; or by 4:00 p.m. on December 10, 2007 if it is to be issued to the voter in person. Absentee ballots must be received by the District Clerk no later than 5:00 p.m. prevailing time, on Tuesday, December 11, 2007. A list of persons to whom absentee ballots are afforded will be available for inspection to qualified voters of the district in the office of the District Clerk between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. on weekdays prior to the day set for the special election, December 11, 2007. On the day set for the election, said list will be posted at the polling place. Any qualified voter present in the polling place may object to the voting of the ballot upon appropriate grounds for making his/her

voters of the district in the office of the District Clerk between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. on weekdays prior to the day set for the special election, December 11, 2007. On the day set for the election, said list will be posted at the polling place. Any qualified voter present in the polling place may object to the voting of the ballot upon appropriate grounds for making his/her challenge and the reasons therefore known to the inspector of election before the close of the polls.
